## Students highlight injustice against women

**THIS YEAR**, the Chandigarh chapter of a global campaign against sexual harassment of women has started from the Post Graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 42.

As a part of One Billion Rising campaign, founded by activist Eve Ensler in 2012, more than 250 girls assembled last week to raise their voice against female infanticide, dowry, sexual abuse, sex slavery and female genital mutilation. They organised a flash mob and through active campaigning, shared stories of injustice done against women. They also highlighted the December 2012 gang rape incident in New Delhi and strongly spoke about the government's responsibility in creating safer public places for women.

The One Billion Rising campaign is a call out to women and men across the world to step out of their homes to raise their voice against sexual harassment of women. Through a series of flash mobs aiming to spread the idea of ending violence against women, the movement has now gained momentum in 205 countries across the world, including India. Since the beginning of the movement, men, women and children

across the country have stepped out of their homes and danced to end violence against women.

For the past three years, Sanjiv Jagori, an organisation that works for equal rights for women, has been actively organising the Chandigarh chapter of the campaign. This year, the Chandigarh Rising campaign is centered on the theme, "Listen, Act and Rise",

wherein men and women are attempting to create a platform to address the violence and everyday sexism faced by women. Flash mobs were also organised at four other locations where women spoke against the fears instilled in them because of societal pressures and attempted to create a positive atmosphere for the girl child to grow in. "We organized flash mobs, poetry recitals

and plays to shed light on the subject. New renditions of literature pieces were also created by the women to eliminate ideas that propagate misogyny," said Jyoti Seth from Sanjiv Jagori.

Mobilising students from Panjab University and its affiliated colleges, the Chandigarh community has been an active participant with the hope of creating a violence-free city for women. "The idea is simple. We gather people from different spheres and ask them to dance. Dance for women safety, dance for protection of women and their bodies, dance to create a revolution," a volunteer from Sanjiv Jagori said.

Over 300 students danced and raised slogans in support of "Revolution 2016: To rise for change and equality". The Sanjiv Jagori team is now planning to hold another awareness drive on February 19 at different locations in the city to take forward the revolution.

Rishika Gaur, a student of Panjab University who has been actively involved in the Chandigarh Rising Campaign for the past two years, said, "The One Billion Rising campaign has turned out to be a strong and active global phenomenon. It has contributed a great deal in galvanising a lot of young, strong-minded individuals to stop violence against women."

# City colleges to have cell to remove doubts

**Chandigarh:** All city colleges will have a choice-based credit system (CBCS) cell to answer queries of students, their parents and teachers regarding the new method that will apply to undergraduate courses from the 2016-17 academic session.

Director, higher education, Jitendra Yadav on Thursday proposed the cell, which, he said, would be the first step towards implementing choice-based

sed credit system. "It will provide counselling for choice of courses and answer queries of students," said Yadav, who was at Post-Graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 42, for a college cluster workshop on choice-based credit system.

The workshop was jointly organised by the college and the state project directorate of the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), Chandigarh.

"The cell will have dedicated staff and will aim to train teachers to further guide students," added Yadav.

### CBCS DECODED



- ▶ It provides choices to students to select elective courses from a wide range, giving more options
- ▶ A flexible system to help students learn at their own pace
- ▶ Allows inter-institutional credits transfer. Forms basis of skill development
- ▶ Option for additional courses. Allows studying a part of the programme at other institution
- ▶ Enhances skill and employability

### WHAT IS CREDIT?

- ▶ A unit by which a course is measured
- ▶ Determines number of hours of instruction per week
- ▶ One credit is equal to one hour teaching per week or two hours of lab, field or project work

Prof SS Chahal, former vice-chancellor, Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, and professor emeritus, PU, gave a comprehensive presentation on 'Framework of Choice-Based Credit System'.

Elaborating on operational and implementation issues, he said, "It will offer a wide range of choices to the students to make them industry-ready. It will offer parity, flexibility, promote mobility and ensure effective learning. It will be applicable to new classes and not

to the students who are already enrolled."

Dr Bhusan Kumar Sharma, principal, SD College, Sector 32, highlighted the calculation of semester grade point average (SGPA) and cumulative grade point average (CGPA) as a measure of performance of a student in all semesters.

A participatory discussion followed and Dalip Kumar, RUSA co-ordinator from Sector 42 college, said such an event would be organised for all stakeholders in future by the state project directorate (RUSA).

# 'Colleges should abide by government's directions'

Binu Dogra, 57, principal of Post Graduate Government College for Girls (PGGCG), Sector 42, served as the vice-principal of Post Graduate Government College for Girls (PGGCG), Sector 11, before taking her current assignment. She shared with **Ifrak Mufti** her views on school education.

as the government has been offering all possible support to various educational institutions in India. We should abide by the directions and guidelines of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) as these bodies work for the welfare of the students and teachers. Their main aim is to improve the quality of education.

**Should teachers be evaluated?**  
In terms of evaluation, we follow a feedback system in colleges, based on the same pattern as that of the varsity. We ask the students to fill the feedback performance form for their respective teachers. It is then submitted to the members of an advisory committee. The advisory committee looks after the feedback forms and passes on directions to the department heads.

**What can be done to improve the infrastructure of the educational institutions?**  
In Chandigarh, the colleges are in good condition. The college authorities are doing fine as they have received ₹2 crore under the (RUSA) to improve the infrastructure. However, the colleges in Punjab are not doing so well because of financial crisis. The employees there don't get timely salaries. Infrastructure is a secondary issue

for them.  
**What are the flaws in our education system?**  
It depends on person to person. People find flaws in everything, but I strongly believe that the students who wish to achieve greatness in life are not bothered about flaws. They make best use of the education facilities they receive.



**How can the educational institutes become self-reliant?**  
We have been working on considering it as a basic need of educational institutes. I believe we have followed the amendments and regulations set up by the Punjab University (PU). Be it the self-financed courses or the vocational courses, we have to go by the PU's nomenclature.

**Does our education system prepare students for life challenges?**  
I believe that we need to include more moral values in our education system as I believe it will help sensitise them about various life challenges. Preparedness depends on the selection of subjects and courses.

**Does the government interfere in the functioning of educational institutions?**  
I would not call it interference

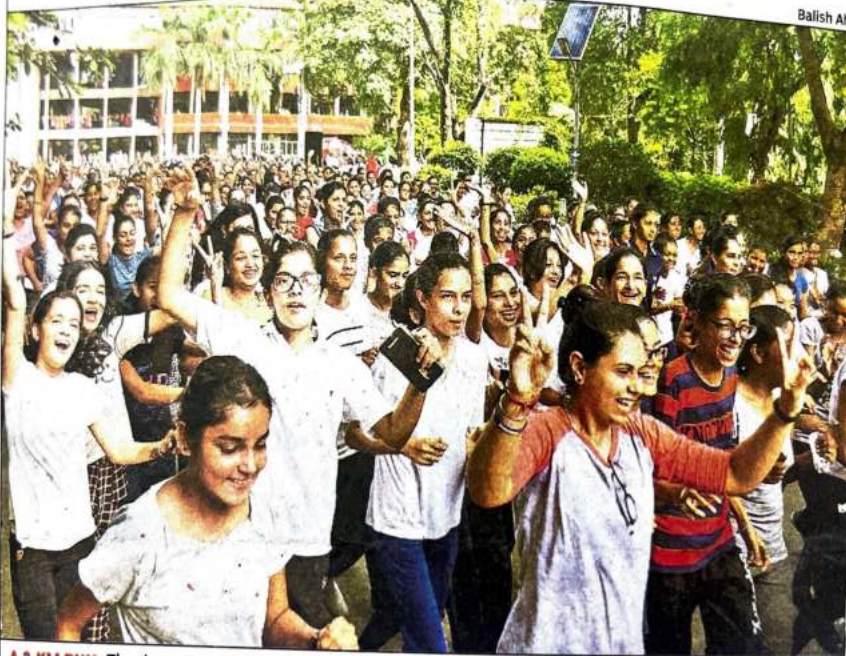

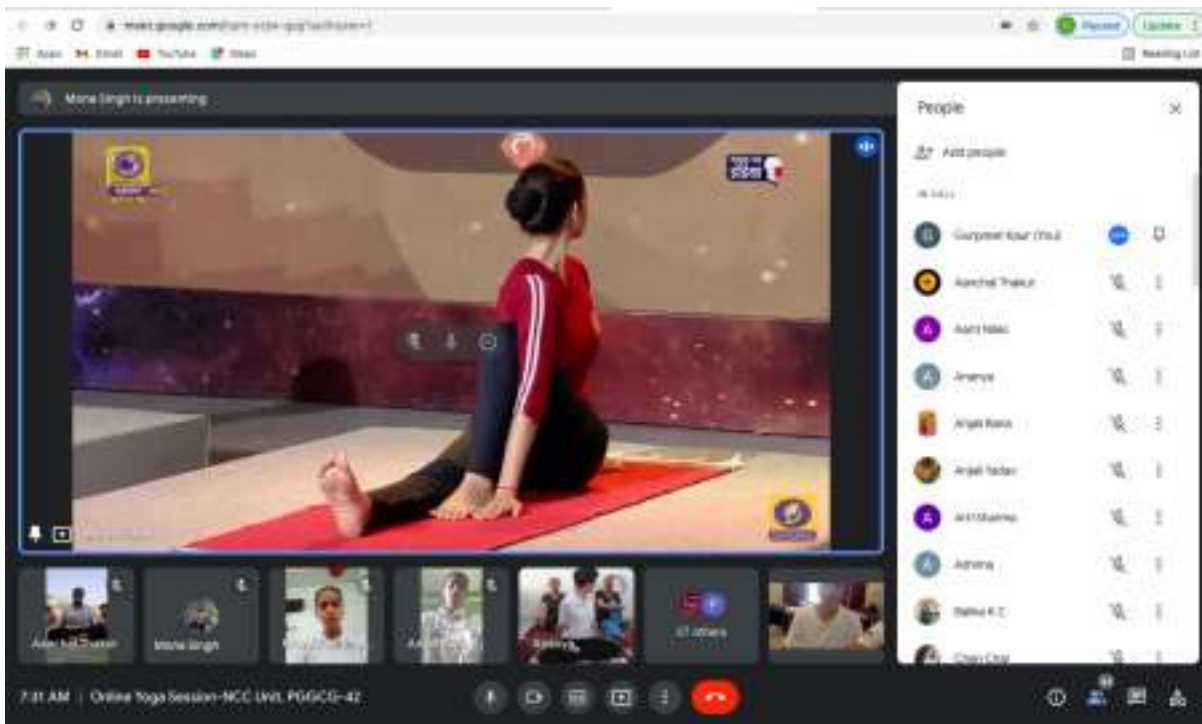


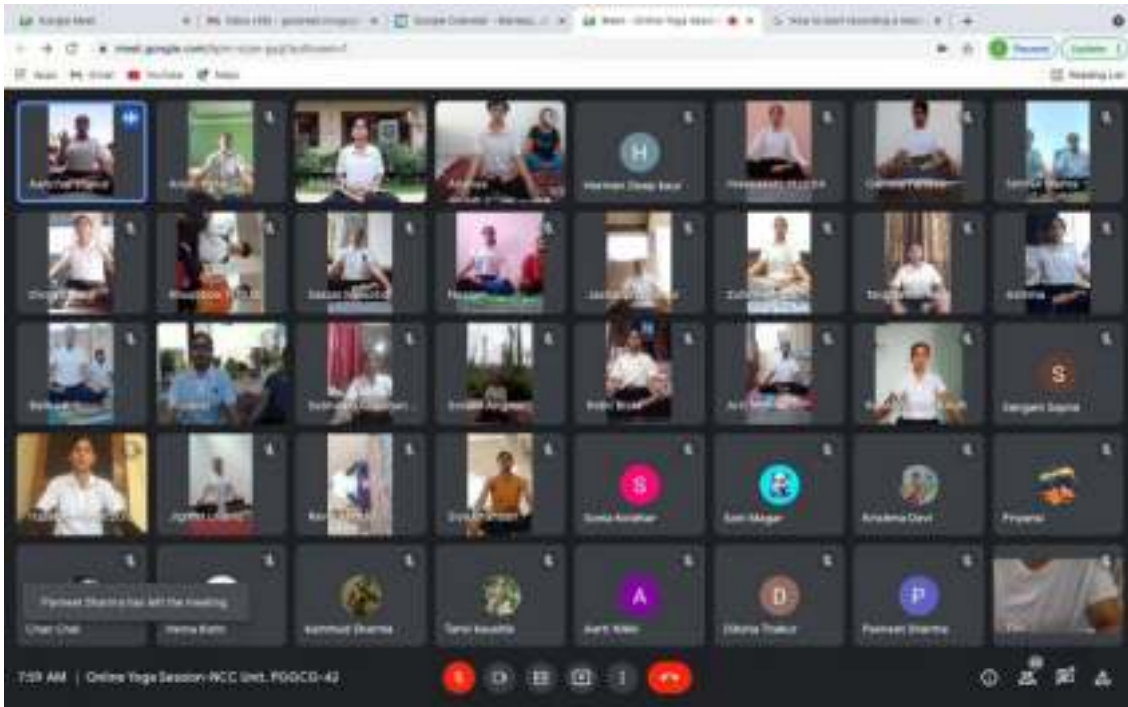
