3.2.1. Institution has created an ecosystem for innovations and has initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

The various initiatives have been taken to create an ecosystem for innovations, creation and transfer of knowledge. Details as follows:

1. Collaborations

A MoU has been signed with Auburn University at Montgomery in furtherance of education benefits and also to carry out joint Research activities, exchange of information and joint participation in internationally funded projects.

2. Industry Academia Partnership

College has MoUs with Xeam Ventures and Eco Laboratories & Consultants Pvt. Ltd. to provide possible training and placement avenues in the field of Human Resource Management and Environment Sciences and related studies respectively.

3. Research Centre

Approved as Research Centre in Zoology by Panjab University, Chandigarh.

4.Students-Holistic Development

Workshops/webinars on the latest and Research related topics are conducted regularly. Field/ Industrial visits are planned for better understanding. Students are encouraged to organize/participate in various fests/competitions of various levels to display their innate talents and skills. This year such fests were organized online and students participated enthusiastically. Students of some courses undergo industrial training/Internship/research project to further enhance their knowledge. Students of functional English also go beyond course knowledge and design and publish 'Scoop' which is an annual newsletter. The students contribute to the college magazine 'Shikhar' as well. Friday Fables and Tele Tuesdays is another platform wherein the students and faculty showcase their story telling talent and is a platform through which they are acquainted with Literature. College has 12 societies, NCC, NSS units that actively conduct various activities regularly to hone the skills and to serve the society.

5. Supporting Infrastructure and Facilities

The available infrastructure and facilities provide an enabling environment to learn, implement and innovate. There are 39 well-equipped laboratories that include a state-of-the-art research lab for life sciences, IT labs, science labs, separate labs for functional English, functional Hindi, performing arts etc.


These laboratories have ICT facilities. The College has a 100 Mbps lease line and provides high-speed Wi-Fi connectivity. The College library is a facilitator that further opens the door to knowledge and innovation. It provides access to e-Books & Journals through DELNET, NDLI & INFLIBNET, for plagiarism check library has a subscription to URKUND. Our library is also the first in the Tricity to have a subscription to VIDWAN- a database of all research work wherein our faculty has uploaded all their research work. To cater to the needs of print disabled the library is equipped with JAWS i.e. a Braille Software and Daisy Reader. To provide a serene and concentrated environment there are separate Cabins for PG/ Research Scholars in the library.

6. Faculty- Upgrading of Skills and Competencies

Many faculty members also undertake various major and minor research projects. In the current session, we have 4 research projects. Many of our faculty members are guiding research scholars. Our faculty members also show active involvement in participation in conferences/seminars/workshops etc. to which they have 29 research papers/articles and 16 books/ edited books/ chapters in books to the credit (AQAR 2020-21 time period). Faculty members also get duty leaves for attending these activities. Teaching and Non-teaching staff members are also encouraged to enhance their qualification.

1. COLLABORATIONS



Memorandum of Understanding

In order to strengthen cross-cultural ties and promote international understanding, academic excellence, international research and development, education for students, faculty and staff, Auburn University at Montgomery and Post-graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 42, Chandigarh ("the parties") agree to the following:

- 1. The parties will encourage direct contact and co-operation between their faculty and administrative staff, divisions, and other units.
- 2. Within fields that are mutually acceptable, the parties intend to pursue the following general forms of cooperation:

 a. Visits by and exchange of undergraduate and graduate students for the purposes of study and research.

- b. Visits by and interchange of staff or faculty for the purposes of research, teaching and conferences for short term visit.
- Exchange of information including, but not limited to exchange of library materials and research publications.
- d. Joint research activities.
- e. Joint participation in internationally funded projects.
- f. Joint course development and delivery leading to diplomas, certificates and degrees.
- g. Advise students on degree, certificate, and diploma program options.
- Both parties acknowledge and understand that all financial arrangements, if any, will be subject to negotiation and prior written agreement and any agreement will be subject to the availability of funds and in accordance with the parties' policies.
- In respect to any particular form of cooperation, this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") may have, from time to time, written agreements annexed to it with regard to any specific project.
- 5. If this MOU remains dormant for three years from the date it is signed by the parties or by the later date of signature if the signatures are not concurrent, it will be deemed to have lapsed. Where this MOU continues to be active, the parties agree to review it with a view to extending its term.
- This MOU may be terminated at any time by either party by mutual written agreement or in any event by two months' written notice from either party to the other for any reason or for no reason.
- This agreement shall be in effect from the date of its signing and will remain in force for a period of 5 (five) years unless it is terminated upon written notice of at least two months by either party.
- 8. Any termination of this MOU under clause 6 will not operate to prejudice an individual student or staff or faculty member engaged as of the date of termination in an activity outlined in sub-clauses (a) or (b) of clause 2. The intention being that such individual activity will be permitted to reach its natural or contemplated conclusion.
- 9. For the purpose of this MOU, "active" means some substantive activity under at least one of the forms of co-operation outlined in clause 2 above.

- 10. A party will ensure that all public statements including statements to the media or articles relating to their joint activities are first cleared by the other party prior to release or publication.
- 11. No party will have the right to use the name or the logo of another party without that party's prior written consent and other conditions attached to such consent.
- 12. There is nothing in this memorandum of understanding that shall be construed as creating a legal relationship between the parties.
- All types of the communications will be sent to the Faculty Program Director and must be copied to the Executive Advisor(s) by name.
