पीजीजीसीजी-42 महाविद्यालय ने चंडीगढ़ पुलिस के पारस्परिक सहयोग से 8 मार्च 2022 को अंतरराष्ट्रीय महिला दिवस मनाने हेतु सबरस प्रेक्षागृह में एक समारोह का आयोजन किया गया, जिसमें मुख्य अतिथि के तौर पर माननीय अनीता धर्मपाल और विशिष्ट अतिथि किरण बिशनोई जी पधारी, कार्यक्रम का उद्घाटन दीप प्रज्वलन करते हुए एवं सरस्वती वन्दना गायन के साथ किया गया। इस दौरान मुख्य-अतिथियों ने महाविद्यालय के परिसर में पौधारोपण किया और परिसर में ही हरी झण्डी दिखाकर महिला ट्रेफिक पुलिसकर्मियों द्वारा ऐक्टिवा पर हेलमेट पहनने की सुरक्षा सम्बन्धी रैली निकाली जो कि महिलाओं और छात्राओं को हेलमेट

की सुरक्षा संबंधी बताना था। इसके बाद अमृत कैन्सर फाउंडेशन द्वारा स्तन कैन्सर सम्बन्धी जांच मशीन का रिबन काटकर उद्घाटन किया गया। इसके बाद परिसर में सांस्कृतिक कार्यक्रम में विभिन्न गतिविधियाँ हुईं, यथा- एमसीएम महाविद्यालय की टीम द्वारा साइबर क्राइम सम्बन्धी एक जागरूक स्किट प्रस्तुत की गयी, जिसमें लोगों को ऑनलाइन धोखाधड़ी से बचने हेतु सतर्कता के साथ जागरूक रहने के लिए बताया। इसके बाद महिला सशक्तिकरण से सम्बंधित एक वृत्तचित्र दिखाया गया जोकि समाज में महिलाओं के योगदान और उनके बलिदान को समर्पित था। इसके बाद चण्डीगढ़ की स्वयं टीम द्वारा मंच पर शारीरिक जोहर के अलग-अलग प्रदर्शन किए गए, जोकि विशेषतः

महिला को स्वयं को सुरक्षित रखने और आत्मनिर्भर बनाने में प्रेरणा प्रदान करता है, और बताया कि कोई भी महिला इस संस्था से जुड़कर आत्मरक्षा का प्रशिक्षण ले सकता है। इसके बाद पुरस्कार वितरण समारोह में महाविद्यालय की प्राचार्या प्रो. (डॉ.) निशा अग्रवाल और भूतपूर्व प्रोफेसर ज्योति सेठ को भी महिला सशक्तिकरण के लिए उनके अथक प्रयासों के लिए सम्मानित करते हुए स्मृति चिह्न प्रदान किया गया। इसके अतिरिक्त चंडीगढ़ महिला पुलिस द्वारा उन लोगों को भी सम्मानित किया गया जिन्होंने घरेलू हिंसा के प्रताड़ित हुए लोगों को पुनः घरबार जोड़ने में अहम भूमिका निभाई। कार्यक्रम के अन्त में भांगड़ा नृत्य की प्रस्तुति हुई, जिसने सभी को मंत्रमुग्ध कर दिया।

REPORT OF ONE BILLION RISING CAMPAIGN- MAY, 2022

Women Cell of PGGCG-42, Chandigarh, in collaboration with Saanjh Jagori organized 'One Billion Rising', a global movement to end violence against women and celebrated OBR Travelling Film Festival, 2022 curated by Aanchal Kapur on 12th May, 2022 in the College auditorium- Sabras.

The College Principal, Prof. Nisha Aggarwal welcomed the panelists and motivated the students to participate in such events of social relevance and outreach.

Dr. Jyoti Seth, chairperson, Saanjh Jagori, Chandigarh introduced the audience about One Billion Rising, the background of the global movement to end violence against women and also talked about the theme of OBR, 2022 - To rise for the bodies of all women, girls and the earth. She, in her inspirational address, called everyone to connect and pointed about the significance for such connect at a deeper, more purposeful, political, transformative and empowering way. It is a global concern and everyone has to rise for the cause, as an activist, to make this year a bold and fearless escalation of artistic risings.

Under OBR travelling Film Festival series, three short films were screened during the morning session and another two films were screened in the afternoon for the hostellers. The films were focused on key issues pertaining to the potential of women who have challenged stereotypical gender roles and become agents of change and empowerment. Each film was followed with an interactive session wherein issues such as negotiating spaces both at home and outside, empowerment through education and knowledge, addressing stereotypical binary gender roles, choosing # kaam ka partners, identifying support systems and working together.

The students had raised many relevant questions and the panelists gave valuable inputs to make them understand every aspect of patriarchy, gender roles, negotiating for their rights. Dr. Neeraj Aggarwal narrated incidents and anecdotes from real life experiences to understand basic concepts of social hierarchy, mind-set in a patriarchal system and how to identify ourselves in these centuries' old social norms, which have been considered normal. She also voiced her views on concerns of girls in the modern tech savvy world, cyber-crime, rights and responsibilities thereof. Based on the films, the panelists- Dr. Iqbal Judge, Dr. Neeraj Aggarwal, Dr. Rewa Rishi and Dr. Jyoti Seth engaged with the students on relevant aspects of existing gender based discriminatory practices and binaries in the social order.

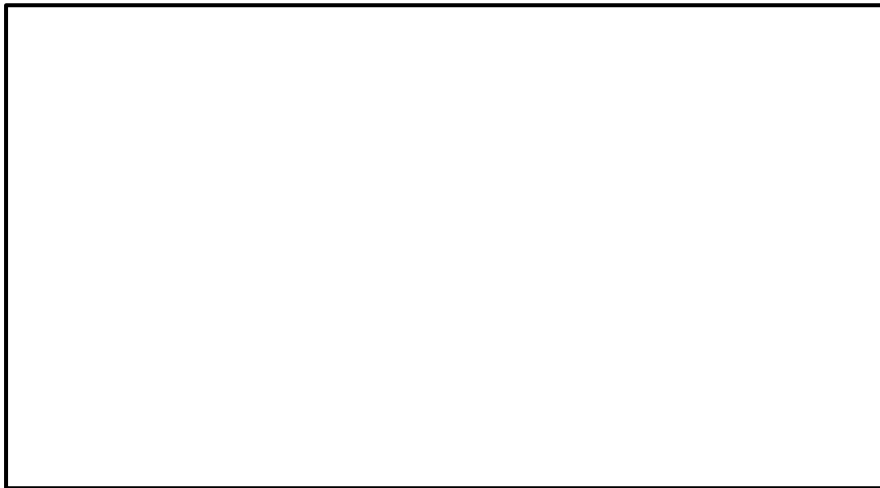
Dr. Jyoti Seth encouraged them to make conscious choices to take control over their own lives. They are also made aware to take responsible decisions to be an agent of change. There was overwhelming response from the students of large group of 450 girl students in the morning session and 150 hostellers in the afternoon session.

The girl students were made to understand their rights as women and how can they bring about change in the lives of women around them, even their mothers at home. The need to engage men in this movement is the need of the hour. It is important to sensitize men around them: their fathers, brothers, sons, husbands and friends towards gender-based discrimination that is prevalent in the society. The students were encouraged to speak and discuss their issues and understand the idea of negotiating spaces and exercising rational thought and logic while making decisions. Dr. Rewa Rishi and Dr. Iqbal Judge spoke about various activities which are carried out by the NGO, Saanjh Jagori to empower women. The role of such NGOs becomes a catalyst of change and development.

All the resource persons are associated with Saanjh Jagori, Chandigarh, a branch of Jagori Grameen, Dharamshala, an NGO that has been working for the cause of girls and women for several years. Women Cell of the College extends gratitude to SaanjhJagori, Chandigarh and Jagori Grameen, Dharamshala for giving a platform of expression to our students wherefrom they can make some

difference in the society. Movies, curated by Aanchal Kapur, are appreciated by the audience. The demand to showcase such motivating and encouraging films is also raised. Thanks to Aanchal Kapur for reaching out to young women through her films.

Ms. Jasreet Kaur, Ms. Anu Bassi, Dr. Nidhi Rana and other members of Women Cell Committee from the Host College facilitated the event. The event was a success as more students wanted to join ranks with Women Cell and work for the cause of women. Women Cell also wants to join hands with Saanjh Jagori to take this movement forward and expects this world a better place to be.
