- Acc. To Preamble Charter of U.N.Declaration of Human Rights:
- "Whereas the people of united Nations have in the charter reaffirmed their faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of human person and in equal rights of men and women."



- It starts with Preamble
- Detailed and comprehensive Rights
- Individuals, not states are the subjects of Rights
- Rights are Universal
- Rights are Non-Justiciable
- Rights are not Absolute

Nature & Characteristics of Human Rights: (contd.)

- Rights are not Absolute
- Based on the principle of Human Liberty, Equality and Brotherhood
- Common standard of achievement for all Nations
- Prohibition to use these rights contrary to the purposes and principles of United Nations
- No mention of Duties
- No body has the right to destroy these Rights
